Overview:

The Phase II of the 2025/2026 Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) Project in the Ashanti Region, Ghana, has successfully improved access to safe and clean water in eight schools. These schools include:

- 1. Banahenkrom Abodom Primary School
- 2. Aburaso Nweneso D/A Primary School
- 3. Nsuta Mpasatie D/A Basic School
- 4. Bokuruwa Brofoyedu Basic School
- 5. Amokrom Nahin D/A Primary School
- 6. Brepro Mpranease D/A Primary School
- 7. Awherewam Adukorama D/A Primary School
- 8. Gyaukrom Akokorso D/A JHS

Project Achievements:

- Eight deep boreholes constructed across eight communities.
- Overhead water reservoir stands installed at all sites.
- School Health Committees formed to ensure sustainability and hygiene promotion.
- Community mobilization and handwashing training activities.
