# Sharon's Story

Before the new well was built at her school (Awirao Primary School in Uganda), Sharon, 14 years old, had to walk a 100-minute round-trip to collect water for her family. Sharon had been missing hours of school every day, because she had to collect water in the morning and afternoon, causing her to perform poorly in school. Sharon says that the new well in her village drastically changed her school performance: "This well is the answer to my education, because it takes me only five minutes to reach the water source, and I will not be reporting to school late anymore when school opens."

#### School Challenge 2020/21

teachers, the 2020/21 School Challenge project

helped fund the construction of two deep wells

and handwashing stations - one each for two

schools in the Adansi South district of Ghana.

Altogether, 59 schools around the world

participated in the challenge. They raised

\$25,956.86, and provided over 870 students,

teachers, and staff with clean water!

# **Project Report**

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to fund the construction of 40 water projects and four latrines stances in two countries, Ghana and Uganda, providing 61,803 people with self-sustaining access to clean water and WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) education. We consider ourselves very lucky to have such long-standing and trusted relationships with our local partners. This trusted relationship enabled us to continue with our mission last year, despite being unable to travel to project sites. By increasing the frequency of updates, and improving upon our methods of communication and reporting with each local partner, we successfully completed our project plan for the 2020-21 fiscal year. All of our local teams are safe, healthy, and have begun project activities for 2021-22! We plan to evaluate every site completed last year as soon as it is safe to travel internationally, and we anticipate some double monitoring trips in 2022. ## What is WASH (Water, Sanitation, Hygiene)?

WASH projects provide adequate water, sanitation, and hygiene services, which are essential components of basic health and well-being. However, clean water and sanitation alone can only go so far. Our local partners also train benefitting communities on crucial WASH behaviours. These training sessions differ slightly for each working region, and include lessons relevant to the area; for example, communities in Uganda learn to wash their mangos before eating. Other lessons include the importance of washing your hands with soap or ash, collecting your water in clean jerry cans, storing your water in a dark, dry place, and keeping latrines and rubbish pits at least 30 metres away from the water source to avoid crosscontamination. Training is also given on how to repair and maintain their source of clean water. Of course, a few WASH-specific training sessions with our local partners is not enough to permanently change the behaviours and habits of an entire community. Thus, our local partners help these communities identify leaders from the village to form Water Committees, who reinforce the lessons annually. We and our partners encourage at least 50% female representation in these committees, because it is women and girls who disproportionately shoulder the burden of collecting water for their families, and therefore, can have the greatest impact on the longevity of our water and sanitation projects. WASH lessons improve the overall health and well-being of these communities, both immediately and over generations ensuring that your donation goes as far as possible!



# The Future of Ryan's Well

Given all the unexpected challenges in 2020-21, our small team, working remotely, has had even more time to dedicate to planning for future risks. We've been setting concrete goals for our three charitable programs (Build, Educate, and Motivate), updating the efficiency and ease-of-use of our website, digitizing our operations, and, ideally, working towards a larger impact each year through set objectives. However, while these are things we already do throughout our work, we've also had the time to experiment with new processes and technologies! We've experimented with the Puente App, which allows our on-the-ground partners to collect and send us data in real time, providing us with even more stories, photos, and information about the project sites and communities to share with you - not just in reports every few months. With the help of members of the Board, we've also introduced an Education Committee, which will help us extend the reach of our Educate program, and provide teachers and students alike with the resources they need to make a difference. While this year has been filled with challenges, it has also given us the opportunity to re-evaluate what we do and how we do it - reaching and supporting even more people each year.
